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Your Home Away From Home



The RV camp at **Broxton Bridge Plantation** has approximately 130 spots for trailers and RVs, complete with electricity and water. We have 6 trails for a total of 58 miles. We have a wonderful bathhouse with 3 small dressing rooms leading off a hall where each dressing room has a shower, commode, and lavatory. There's no need to go up and down a hallway looking for the dressing area or the bathroom.



We also have a Snack Shack for items that people may need in the event that they may have forgotten them in their haste to get on the road and reach us. This includes items such as milk, bread, mayonnaise, soup, sandwiches and other prepackaged food – a convenience for people who have ridden all day and tended to their horses and are too tired to cook for themselves.

Our campground is on a very scenic and historic part of the plantation. It is only a very short distance from a battleground from the War Between the States (1861-1865) and is on the same location where 150-250 years ago it was used for camp meetings, where all the local people from both sides of the river would come and set up their tents after “lay-by” time. This was the time after the crops had been cultivated, usually the last week in June and the first week in July. This also included July 4, which was very

convenient. The river is approximately a mile wide at this point and the predominant winds and breezes come from the west across this water and make a nice cool spot in warm weather. All of this is located on a 25-30 foot bluff where the trees have never been cut. There are some beautiful hardwood trees on this bluff and in the swamp and leading up to the river.



For the trail riders who do not have living facilities in their trailers, we offer a B&B comprised of two houses: one built in 1850 (Kinard House) and one built in 1880 (Folk House). They are both very comfortable.



There is also available a meeting hall, where we have had 135 people for a sit down meal. The meeting hall is also useful for dances, receptions, etc.

We have two fishponds and many miles of the Salkehatchie River swamp that are available for fishing (you have to have a license to fish in the river).

Most of the RV spots in the campground are shaded.
